

Nomination Criteria

Athlete

- --- MHS graduate minimum of at least 10 years.
- --- Showed a high standard of sportsmanship, leadership, and citizenship pre and post graduation.
- --- athletic excellence during high school.
- --- collegiate experience not a requirement, but taken into consideration.
- --- represented MHS in a positive fashion (including alumni years).

Team

- --- All members are MHS graduates of at least 10 years.
- --- Groups that have set themselves apart from other teams with accomplishments such as undefeated seasons, championships, and state tournament victories.

- Coaches --- Must have left MHS in good standing for a minimum of 5 years.
 - --- Had an extended career of coaching and made an outstanding contribution to MHS athletics during their tenure.

- Honoree --- Deceased person is immediately eligible.
 - --- Can be a school administrator, community member, volunteer, or athletic supporter that has put in excessive time, money, or other resources.
 - --- Person was in good standing with coaches, players, and school officials.
 - --- If the person is a school official, they must have departed from the Mayville School system.
