### Instructions for Scholarship Application

1. The attached application is to be used for the **Lloyd and Lula White Memorial Scholarship** offered through the Tuscola County Community Foundation. **One (1) \$500 scholarship is available to be awarded to senior graduating from Mayville High School.** The scholarship award is distributed to the institution of higher education selected by the scholarship recipient or directly to the recipient. Selection shall be made by the Tuscola County Community Scholarship Grant Committee based upon the completion of the appropriate scholarship application.

2. Applications and required attachments should be **returned (postmarked) by March 15, 2022 to:**

**Applicants must be a senior graduating from Mayville High School.**

3. Applications should be typed or legibly printed in ink and must be signed by applicant. Applications not signed will not be considered.
4. Submit the **original application and 7 copies (including letter of recommendation and any attachments)**. Please have original printed single sided and no staples.
5. Attach to the application **and each copy of the application** an essay not to exceed two (2) typewritten pages, double-spaced, 12 point font addressing the following:
  - a. Why do you merit this award?
  - b. Include a brief biographical story of your life.
  - c. What do you expect to be doing in five to eight years? Keep your education and career goals in mind.
6. Along with the application, submit one (1) official transcript with the original application.

7. Letters of recommendation may be included with the application. If they are included please copy each recommendation and attach it (them) to each application.

The Lloyd and Lula White Memorial Scholarship was established as a tribute to my grandparents.

Lloyd White was born at Juniata on August 3, 1897. Lloyd was one of Lewis and Sylvia Kilbourn White's 6 children.

Lula Dickerson White was born in Rich Township on August 23, 1895. Lula was one of William and Janet Anderson Dickerson's 8 children.

Lloyd and Lula were united in marriage on February 2, 1915. The couple were lifelong residents of the Mayville area where they raised their 4 children. The White's loved a very simple farm life instilling a strong work ethic, character and a sense of belonging into each of their children. Lloyd was active in a farming life even as his sons became more involved in the farming operation. The boy's involvement allowed my grandparents to move into town and pursue other interests. However, farming was always grandpa's first love as you could always find him at one of the boy's farms during growing season. I was Lloyd's second oldest grandson. I remember farmers "exchanging help," that was when the farmers in the neighborhood would follow the threshing machine from farm to farm for the harvest. Pitching in and helping with whatever needed to be done was important to my grandparents and has been a model that I have tried to live and raise my family by.

My family and I would like this scholarship to help a graduating Mayville student pursue his or her farm community values and aspirations.
